Did you know that turf grass (your lawn) is the largest crop grown in the Chesapeake Bay watershed—totaling more than 3.8 million acres? Property owners spread nearly 215 million pounds of nitrogen fertilizer on their lawns, 40%–70% of which runs into streams or filters into the groundwater.

Proper mowing is one of the most important ways to maintain a healthy lawn

- Mow only when grass is dry to get a clean cut and minimize the spread of disease.
- Mow grass to a height of 2-3 inches. The longer the grass, the more water is retained. Keeping your grass longer also may allow it to out-compete weeds, reducing the need for herbicides.
- Mow frequently, cutting not more than a third of the height of the grass at a time.
- Sharpen your mower blades once a year to avoid damaging grass blades.
- Do not dispose of grass clippings in nearby waters. The clippings will break down and encourage the growth of algae which depletes the oxygen in water. If you choose not to leave your clippings on your lawn, compost them.

Lawn maintenance for water quality

- If you have a lawn, limit its size and break it up with other mixed height plantings.
- A lawn can have a variety of grasses and plants. Enjoy your weeds and their varying root depths (dandelions grow deep tuberous roots that pull nutrients and water deep into the soils)
- Lawns should be brown in the summer heat, resting after the spring growth spurt and using stored energy to grow deep roots. Maintaining green grass with constant watering is a stress on your lawn. Water only if necessary and water deeply when you do.
- Long grass means good roots, less stress and good health. Grass should be mowed to 3+ inches in height and never more than 1/3 of the blade at one time (sugars/cellulose needed for root growth should remain on the plant). In late fall after the grass has set up for winter (begins to brown), cut it shorter;
- Leave mulched grass clippings on your lawn to add nutrients back into the soil.
- Fertilizers create thatch (densely growing roots) which attracts grubs.
- Lawn aeration is the secret to a healthy lawn. By extracting a soil core/plug or using a spike aerator, the soil can breathe, allowing oxygen and water to become more available to the roots. Organic fertilizers may have too much nitrogen, which will acidify the soil and make grass susceptible to insects.
- If after testing your soil you determine that it needs a boost, use a balanced fertilizer such as a compost tea or manure tea at one-half the recommend strength.

Public Works Projects for 2018

There will be a number of roads that will be milled and new paving placed in 2018.

The list of the roads are:

- **Creek Hill Road** from Millcross to Willow Road including the intersection at Millcross.
- **Crest Avenue** from Rt. 462 to Woodland Drive.
South Eastland from Rt. 462 to Woodland Drive.
- **South Oakview Road** from Rt.30 to Greenland Drive.

There will be surface treatment applied to **Glendale Drive** and **Colonial Village Lane**.

Penn-Dot projects in East Lampeter will consist of mill and pave **Rt. 30** from Oakview road to Rt. 896. They will also be milling and paving **Eastbrook Road** from Rt. 30 to Rt. 340. The County will be replacing the **Eden Road/Millcross Road bridge** over the Conestoga River. The project will take approximately 18 months.

The Sewer Department will be replacing Mechanical components throughout our low pressure sewer system.

There will also be upgrades to a pumping station and security fences installed. We will also be televising existing sewer lines investigating for infiltration into the sewers and conditions of pipes.

The staff will be investigating our sewer easements to make sure there are no obstructions in the area of our pipes in case there is an emergency of a clog or a break in the line. You will be notified with a letter stating when they are in your area.

In the Parks it was discovered at Community Park on Hobson Road that some of the trees were infected with a bacterial leaf scorch. There are approximately 70 trees that are affected. We will be phasing out this project of replacing all infected trees. We will be removing around 7 each year and replacing, and also treating the others with a chemical that will prolong their lives.

These are just some of the things the Public Works Department will be working on.

Commute PA Newsletter

Commuter Services of Pennsylvania is excited to announce the launch of its new rideshare and rewards program for area commuters. **Commute PA** will help commuters find rideshare partners as well as reward them for tracking green trips. The program is mobile-friendly to allow easy access directly from a smartphone and is available as an iOS app to download.

Commuters can track their telework, transit, carpool, bicycle, walk or vanpool trips for work and earn points for each trip. In addition, users can track and earn points for personal green trips, such as a bike ride to the grocery store or carpool trip to the beach. Those points can then be redeemed for rewards from local and national restaurants, retail locations and entertainment venues. Commuters can also see statistics such as money saved, gallons of gas saved, calories burned and emissions prevented by using an environmentally-friendly commute.

Commuters who use a green commute mode, more than two times a week to work can take advantage of the free **Emergency Ride Home** program as well. Commuters need to track their green commute trips in Commute PA to be eligible and submit the forms. The commuter finds their own transportation for the emergency and Commuter Services of Pennsylvania will then reimburse commuters if they get a taxi, Uber, Lyft or have a family member or friend take them where they need to go.

FREE Home Compost Workshops Scheduled

The Lancaster County Solid Waste Management Authority (LCSWMA) is partnering with municipalities, community organizations and Penn State Master Gardeners of Lancaster County to conduct home compost workshops where residents will learn how to recycle organic waste from their kitchens and gardens instead of putting it in the trash. Composting is an excellent way to recycle vegetable scraps, grass clippings, leaves, and other organic materials and turn them into a useful and valuable soil amendment.

Workshop attendees will also learn how to build effective, yet inexpensive home compost bins to meet their needs. Each household in attendance will be eligible to receive a free kitchen scrap collection bucket and enter a raffle for a home compost bin courtesy of LCSWMA.

Lancaster County residents are invited to attend any one of the home compost workshops scheduled for this year. If required, residents should pre-register by no later than Friday at noon prior to the workshop they'll be attending.


