## ORDINANCE NO. 221 OF 1999

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF EAST LAMPETER, LANCASTER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 116 WHICH REGULATES TRAFFIC AND PARKING IN THE TOWNSHIP, BY AMENDING ARTICLE III, SECTION 2, SUBPARAGRAPH (a) OF SAID ORDINANCE (SECTION 15, PART 4, §402(1) OF THE PROPOSED CODE OF ORDINANCES) BY ESTABLISHING AN ADDITIONAL LOCATION WHERE PARKING SHALL BE PROHIBITED.

WHEREAS, on September 14, 1987, the Township of East Lampeter adopted Ordinance No. 116, as amended, regulating traffic and parking in the Township and repealing all prior ordinances inconsistent therewith; and

WHEREAS, the Township is now desirous of amending Article III, Section 2, subparagraph

(a) of said ordinance for the purpose of prohibiting parking on the north side of Old Philadelphia

Pike between Horseshoe Road and the Route 30 westbound on-ramp.

BE AND IT IS HEREBY enacted and ordained as follows:

1. That Article III, Section 2, subparagraph (a) of Ordinance No. 116 of the Township of East Lampeter, Pennsylvania, (Section 15, Part 4, §402(1) of the proposed Code of Ordinances) is amended to include the following:

Street Side Between

Old Philadelphia Pike North Horseshoe Road and Route 30 westbound on-ramp

- 2. All other provisions of Ordinance No. 116, as amended from time to time, shall remain in full force and effect as heretofore adopted.
  - 3. This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days after the date of its enactment.
