Operation and maintenance has occurred on some PCSM BMPs. The Township is enacting a plan through this permit cycle to inspect all the BMPs to create a baseline for the inventory. As the baseline has been created we have been issuing the initial inspection report to owners. The first 2 years are inspecting all of the BMPs and the next 3 years are implementing the self inspection program to be completed by the owners. We have over 500 BMPs in the Township.
