Public Meeting Arrangements

Rainbarrels, and some cisterns, need to be emptied and disconnected from downspouts before we see freezing temperatures. These stormwater management devices can be damaged by freeze-thaw impacts, and can cause snow melt from your roof to freeze up the downspouts, potentially leading to roof damage. Please check the manufacture directions or owner's manual for your rainbarrel or cistern to see what maintenance needs to happen when to keep your stormwater management device working well.

...And To Sweep Your Local Storm Drain!

Storm drains keep stormwater and snow melt flowing down and away from roadways and properties, but they can only do that if water can get through the drain grates! Please help keep these drains functioning by periodically cleaning brush, leaves, and snow off of the storm drain tops near your property. Thank you!



Got Yard Waste?

It's that time again to start raking up the leaves and cleaning up the yard. Please remember that in East Lampeter Township, leaves and other yard waste are considered to be recyclable and therefore CANNOT BE BURNED. A citation can be given for not obeying this ordinance. If you wish to report any burning violations, please contact the East Lampeter Township Police Department at 291-4676.

So where should you go with all the leaves and other yard waste? First, you can contact your trash hauler. They are required to pick up yard waste. They usually will provide you with a yard waste tag or bag for a small fee. Contact your trash hauler for more information. You could also compost your yard waste. If you are interested in learning about home composting, contact the Lancaster County Solid Waste Management Authority at 717-397-9968 or www.lcswma. org for more information.

What is LIHWAP?

The Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) is a temporary emergency program to help low-income families pay overdue water bills. LIHWAP is a grant. You do not have to repay it.

To receive help...

- · Apply starting January 4, 2022.
- · You don't have to be on public assistance.
- · You need to have an unpaid water bill.
- · You can either rent or own your home.

How does LIHWAP work?

LIHWAP Crisis grants may be available if you have an emergency situation and are in jeopardy of losing your water service. You can receive one Crisis grant for your drinking water service and one Crisis grant for your wastewater service, up to \$2,500 each.

Crisis situations include:

- Past-due water bills.
- · Termination of utility service.
- Danger of having utility service terminated (received a notice that service will be shut off within the next 60 days).

How do I apply?

- Apply online at www.compass.state.pa.us.
- Request an application by calling the Statewide Customer Service Center at 877-395-8930 or call PA Relay at 711 for the hearing impaired.
- Applications are available at your local county assistance office.

To apply, you will need:

- · Names of people in your household;
- · Dates of birth for all household members;
- Social Security numbers for all household members;
- Proof of income for all household members; and
- A recent water bill.

Who is eligible?

You may qualify for a LIHWAP grant if:

- You must have an overdue water bill that you are responsible for paying.
- Your household income meets the following income guidelines:

After your application is processed, you will receive a written notice that will tell you if you qualify. If eligible, it will tell you the amount of your grant.
