


Detective Scott Eelman

The East Lampeter Township Police Foundation is beginning to take shape. With just a few meetings, a lot has been accomplished.

We approved the following mission statement: "As an independent 501 (C) (3) charitable, non-profit organization, the East Lampeter Township Police Foundation's mission is to feet

Township Police Foundation's mission is to foster community-wide support for law enforcement, provide supplemental resources for members of law enforcement and their families while building long lasting and positive police-community relationships."

The board is awaiting approval of the 501(C)(3) nonprofit designation from the IRS. Although we have been meeting monthly, we anticipate being able to shift to quarterly meetings once the foundation is up and running. The foundation meets at the East Lampeter Township building but operates separately from the East Lampeter Police Department.

Despite plans being in the early stages, we have discussed several projects that need funding. Seija, East Lampeter's official police trauma dog, is one project that the foundation will support. The board members are looking at opportunities to attend local community events to spread the word and answer questions about the foundation. We plan to include Seija, when possible, so that she can meet her public.

Chief Steve Zerbe presented needs from the police department. The procurement of extra equipment would make it easier for the officers to operate. Currently, officers share devices and must take the time to recalibrate items before handing them over to the next patrol. Additionally, safety equipment such as strobe lights would alert drivers to a roadway issue. These flashing lights can be attached to the officer's uniform or placed on traffic cones to increase visibility at night or during inclement weather.

East Lampeter Sewer Authority (ELSA) is planning a sewer extension along Strasburg Pike in the area of Millstream Road and Windy Hill Road.

The Authority applied for and was awarded American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding through the Lancaster County Commissioners at their February 21st, 2024, meeting. The total project cost is estimated at approximately \$635,000.00. The Authority was seeking a 50% match to do the project and was awarded \$317,460.00.



The extension will consist of a low-pressure system to service approximately six residential properties, where there are a few failing onlot systems. There are still agreements to sign, permitting, and final designs to be approved. At the time of this publication, we do not have an exact date of completion.

In July 2022, Pennsylvania adopted a new fertilizer law designed to reduce nutrient pollution in waterways. For more information on the new PA Fertilizer Law, visit the Department of Agriculture's website at www.agriculture. pa.gov/fertilizer or contact Denise Uzupis at duzupis@pa.gov.

Highlights of the new fertilizer law include:

- Nitrogen is limited to 0.9 pounds of total nitrogen and 0.7 pounds of available nitrogen per 1000 ft2 per application.
- No phosphorus can be applied unless establishing or repairing turf.
- Both the nitrogen and phosphorus rates can be adjusted based on soil test recommendations and/or if using an enhanced efficiency fertilizer (these are specifically designed to stay more on the plant than runoff to the stream).

Other important notes about applying fertilizers:

- Do not apply fertilizer if a heavy rain is expected.
- Keep fertilizer away from drainage ditches, storm drains, or water.
 - Don't apply fertilizer within 15 feet of any stream banks.
- Remove fertilizer from hard surfaces (i.e., driveways and sidewalks) and sweep it back to the lawn.
 - Do not use fertilizer as a snow or ice melt.
- Do not spread fertilizer on snow-covered or frozen ground.
- Fertilizer applications between December 15 and March 1 are restricted to 0.50 lbs. of total nitrogen per 1000 ft2 per application.

There is a lot of turf and lawn grass in PA, like lawns and golf courses, on over 2 million acres, according to the DCNR! Choosing the right turfgrass management program is essential to protecting local waterways.

You should do a soil test to see what nutrients your lawn really needs before buying or applying any feeds or fertilizers. Soil tests show you how much nitrogen (N), phosphorous (P), and potassium (K) your lawn currently has and how

much it needs. Soil test kits can be ordered for a relatively low cost from the local Penn State extension office. The results of the soil test can help you buy and apply just the right kind and amount of fertilizer or feed for your lawn to be healthy.

FYI: Most fertilizers list their percentages of N-P-K somewhere on their container, usually as a set of three separated numbers, so a bag of fertilizer with numbers 26-0-5 on it has 26% nitrogen (N), 0% phosphorous (P), and 5% potassium (K).

Other Healthy Lawn Tips:

- Check your soil health—Healthy soil that isn't compacted, has a good pH-level, good texture, and good levels of organic matter will give you a happy, healthy lawn.
- Raise your mower deck—Set your mower deck to 3 inches or higher or use low-mow grass mixes. Taller grass reduces weeds, gives stronger roots, and holds water and nutrients better.
- Mulch your grass—Keeping your clippings in place returns valuable organic matter and nutrients to your lawn.
- Provide a buffer—Do not mow up to the banks of streams. Maintaining vegetative buffers along waterways provides wildlife habitat while slowing and filtering water before it enters the stream.




