It's that time again to start raking up the leaves and cleaning up the yard. Please remember that in East Lampeter Township, leaves and other yard waste are considered to be recyclable and therefore cannot be burned.

- A citation can be given for not obeying this ordinance.
- If you wish to report any burning violations, please contact the East Lampeter Township Police Department at 717-291-4676.

Where should you go with all the leaves and other yard waste?

- First, you can contact your trash hauler. They are required to pick up yard waste. They will usually provide you with a yard waste tag or bag for a small fee. Contact your trash hauler for more information.
- You could also compost your yard waste. East Lampeter Township has a partnership with Manheim Township for the use of the Manheim Township Compost Park. This partnership allows residents of East Lampeter Township the opportunity to purchase a card to be used at the Manheim Township Compost Park, just like Manheim Township residents. The card can then be shown to the attendant at the compost park and the fee paid for whatever load is being disposed of at the time. Those fees are paid based on the Manheim Township Compost Park fee schedule. Please note that only one card will be issued per address. Cards can be purchased at the East Lampeter Township building for a nominal fee of \$5.00 with proof of residency. Proof of residency shall consist of any state or federal identification with an address in East Lampeter Township. Please note that occupants of apartments and commercial uses are not eligible to purchase the card. East Lampeter Township card holders are responsible for adherence to all Manheim Township Compost Park Rules and Regulations; failure to follow the rules and regulations will result in card deactivation. Information regarding the location, hours and rules for the Manheim Township Compost Park can be found on the Manheim Township web site www. manheimtownship.org.
- Residents are also able to use the West Earl Township yard waste facility if that is preferred. Access cards for this facility can only be purchased at the West Earl Township office.

Loose Dogs in East Lampeter Township

The East Lampeter Township Police Department responds to over 300 calls involving animals every year.

The Police Department would like residents to know that most loose dogs



have no identification tags, no valid-worn license, and no proof of rabies vaccination.

Pennsylvania state law requires that all dogs be annually licensed in the respective county of residence by three months old. Licenses in Lancaster County can be purchased through the Lancaster County Treasurers Office (https://www.co.lancaster.pa.us/2689/Dog-License) on an annual basis or lifetime basis if your dog is microchipped. Licensing violations can result in fines and costs up to \$500.00 for each violation.

The state of Pennsylvania requires local municipalities to take responsibility for loose dogs. This job falls on the shoulders of the police department to catch/capture and transport stray dogs to their owner, if known, or to the Humane League. This costs taxpayers approximately \$15,000.00 annually!

Until 2022, these costs were supported solely by tax dollars. However, East Lampeter Township has passed an ordinance that allows the Township to invoice dog owners for their pets getting loose.

- Owners of stray dogs that are caught and transported to an owner's property are subject to a \$100.00 fine.
- Owners of stray dogs that are caught and transported to the Humane League are subject to a \$200.00 fine for the first or second offense.
- Owners of stray dogs that are caught more than twice in a calendar year are subject to a fine of \$300.00 per additional incident.
- These fines and related costs are in addition to any licensing violations.

Pennsylvania law requires all dogs to always be under their owner's control and for all dogs to be leashed whenever off property. Collars with tags including annual state licensing, the pet's name, address, owner's contact information, and current rabies vaccine should always be worn on the collar at all times. This is part of responsible pet ownership.

Loose Farm Animals in East Lampeter Township

The East Lampeter Township Police Department responds to over 300 calls involving animals every year. Most of these calls are for loose animals, ranging from dogs to a wide variety of farm animals.

While the Police Department can successfully find farms to temporarily house loose farm animals until such time the owners are located and animals are retrieved, this often takes multiple officers and civilians to accomplish this.

The Township wants to encourage all animal owners to make sure that their outside pens, fencing, gates, runs, leashes, and harnesses are secure enough to keep their animals confined. Grazing farm animals secured with a couple temporary wires used to contain or corral is not sufficient fencing. These large animals can cause extensive damage and loss of life when they are loose, not to mention the potential civil litigation that can be involved.

If you own, keep, or tend to farm animals, please take the time to check the enclosures to make sure they are secure enough to retain the livestock.

Public Works Winter Maintenance

When snow arrives, our Public Works Department will be busy performing snowplowing of your roadway. You will see a plow pass in front of your home at least twice in both directions. On the second pass, the plow will push the snow back from curb to curb or edge of cart way to edge of cart way. This will allow us to push more snow if we get another storm. Please don't shovel your driveway until you see that your street has been plowed curb to curb. By doing this, you will avoid having to clean your driveway more than once. If possible, park your vehicles in your driveway during a snowstorm. This will help us to push the snow back



to open the cartway from curb to curb or the edge of the cartway. When the winter season is over, topsoil will be placed on any yards that were affected by the plowing operations. Please call the Township office at 717-393-1567 and give your name, address, and phone number. Your name will be placed on a list, which our Public Works Department will take care of in the spring.

Solicitation Permits



East Lampeter Township's solicitation ordinance requires that all solicitors within the Township acquire a permit and register with the East Lampeter Township Police Department. Solicitors should have a permit that looks like the attached sample with their photo, name and business name available. Soliciting is limited to the hours between 9:00 AM and 8:00 PM. Residents should ask any solicitors that come to their property to show their Township permit. If

the solicitor does not have a permit with them, please contact the Police Department. Township staff is currently working to provide a list of active solicitation permits issued for the year on the Township website in the near future.
