Snow Removal: What to Expect this Winter

As winter weather approaches, our Public Works team is ready to keep your streets safe and accessible. Here's what you can expect during snow events and how you can help the process run smoothly.

Our Snow Removal Process

When snow begins to fall, you'll see our plows make multiple passes through your neighborhood. Each street receives at least two full passes in both directions. The first pass clears a travel lane, while the second pass pushes snow back from curb to curb (or from edge to edge on roads without curbs). This two-step approach creates maximum road width and leaves room for snow storage if additional storms follow.

Timing Your Driveway Cleanup

Wait to shovel your driveway until after the street has been fully plowed curb to curb. This simple step will save you from having to clear your driveway twice. Our plows will inevitably push some snow back into driveway entrances during the final pass, so patience here pays off.

Help Us Help You

Move vehicles into driveways or off-street parking during snow events. Cars parked on the street prevent our crews from pushing snow back to the curb line, reducing the available travel width and limiting our ability to handle future storms effectively.

Daylight Savings Time

It's that time of year again to fall back! Remember to turn your clocks back one hour and replace your smoke detector batteries on November 2, 2025.



Don't Burn Your Yard Waste-It's Against the Law

Fall cleanup season is here! Before you start that leaf pile, remember: burning leaves and yard waste is illegal in East Lampeter Township. You could face a citation. To report burning violations, call East Lampeter Township Police at 717-291-4676.

Where to Take Your Yard Waste

- Option 1: Your Trash Hauler Contact your regular trash company—they're required to pick up yard waste. Most provide special tags or bags for a small fee.
- Option 2: Manheim Township Compost Park. East Lampeter Township residents can buy a \$5 access card (with proof of residency) at the East Lampeter Township building. Find location, hours, and rules at www.manheimtownship. org/1009/Compost-Park
- Option 3: West Earl Township Yard Waste Facility. Access cards available only at the West Earl Township office. Find location, hours, and rules at www.westearltwp.org/ about/pages/yard-waste-compost-facility
